This summer, 7th grade students will read


Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry by Mildred Taylor

Before the first day of school, you will complete one of the projects and answer four of the questions on the attached sheet for *Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry*. You will also complete the attached book report form for your choice novel.



About the Newbery Medal Winner, Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry...

"Set in Mississippi at the height of the Depression, this is the story of one family's struggle to maintain their integrity, pride, and independence in the face of racism and social injustice. And it is also Cassie's story—Cassie Logan, an independent girl who discovers over the course of an important year why having land of their own is so crucial to the Logan family, even as she learns to draw strength from her own sense of dignity and self-respect." IMPORTANT: Students will be tested on the required reading selection during the beginning weeks of school; in addition, they may be asked to write or complete projects relating to the novel.



Summer Reading Projects for Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry

Please complete both parts for Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry.

Part 1: Choose below <u>one</u> project to demonstrate the important parts of the book you read over the summer. See the rubric for grading guidelines.

- Art log: Make an artistic log of each chapter of the book. Divide a paper into two sections. Each section will be one chapter. Illustrate each chapter symbolically or literally. If the chapters have titles, write the title at the bottom of each section. You should have all chapters represented in the art.
- 2. **Letter to a character:** Write a letter (3 paragraph of 5-7 sentences minimum) to the main character of your book asking questions, protesting a situation, and/or making a complaint and/or suggestion. This must be done in correct MLA letter format.
- 3. **Travel brochure:** Make a travel brochure advertising the setting, the characters, and the plot of the book. Each "flap" of the brochure should represent the parts of the novel.
- 4. **Diary**: Write a diary that one of the story's main characters might have kept before, during, or after the book's events. Remember that the character's thoughts and feelings are very important in a diary. You must have at least 3 diary logs. Each log must be 7-9 well written sentences.
- 5. **Timeline**: Create a timeline of important events from the book. You must include at least 10 events and illustrations for each event.
- 6. **Write a song**: Convert the events of the story into a ballad, poem, or song. Write the lyrics and adapt the words to a well-known melody. Retell the story through your lyrics. Make sure you state what melody you used when writing your lyrics. You should have at least 20 lines to your song.

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Part 2: Answer <u>four</u> of the following questions, typed on another sheet of paper. You need to write a well written paragraph (5-7 sentences). Please write which question you are answering.

- Give the names of the three most important characters and a brief description of each (age, personality, physical description, relationships to other characters). Describe how the characters are like or not alike you.
- 2. Identify the setting of the book. Be sure to identify all important times and places. Compare the setting to your current hometown.
- 3. Identify the main problem faced by the characters in this book. Have you experienced similar problems? How is the problem solved or resolved?
- 4. Could the story have ended differently? How would you have liked it to end?
- 5. Write a paragraph telling something you have seen or done yourself which is related to the material read in this story.
- 6. How would your life be different if you have lived through some of the experiences of the story?
- 7. Select an incident from the book that appeals to you (that you liked or thought was interesting). Give at least 3 reasons why you liked it.
- 8. How might the story have been different from another character's point of view (for example, Cinderella told from Prince Charming's perspective)?
- 9. Did you expect the story to end the way it did? What clues did the author give as to how it would end.
- 10. How would your life be different if you have lived through some of the experiences of the story?
- 11. Select an incident from the book that appeals to you (that you liked or thought was interesting). Give at least 3 reasons why you liked it.
- 12. How might the story have been different from another character's point of view (for example, Cinderella told from Prince Charming's perspective)?
- 13. Did you expect the story to end the way it did? What clues did the author give as to how it would end.
